The Problem

Although bi+ people make up over 60 percent of the LGBTQ+ community in the United States, bi+ people are consistently overlooked in film, television, and the media.

When bi+ people are included, their depiction is largely stereotypical and reductive.

The Symptoms

- From 2014 2022, there were only <u>55 bi+speaking characters</u> out of the 38,726 speaking characters in the top-grossing films; this amounts to only 0.14% of speaking characters.
- There were only <u>149 bi+ TV characters</u> in 2023.
- Less than 7% of all LGBTQ+ news media coverage over the last 30 years was of bi+ people and issues.

Discrimination On Screen Feeds Discrimination Off Screen

- Bi+ people are paid less than gay, lesbian, and straight people.
- Bi+ people have <u>higher rates of poverty</u> and <u>experience anxiety</u> at higher rates than gay, lesbian and straight people.
- Over <u>60% of bi+ women have been raped</u>, assaulted, or stalked.
- Nearly half (47%) of bi+ men will experience sexual violence compared to 40% of gay men and 21% of straight men.
- Bi+ people of color <u>fare far worse</u> than their non-LGBTQ+ counterparts in employment, income level, food insecurity, and healthcare access.
- <u>Less than 1 percent</u> of all domestic grant dollars awarded to LGBTQ+ communities and issues goes toward bi+ communities and issues.

What We Do



Script-to-Screen Consulting

We partner with studios, writers, filmmakers, and actors from script to screen to create authentic and accurate bi+ characters and ensure effective production strategies for bi-normative cinema.



Investment in Bi+ Voices

Through fellowships for emerging writers and partnerships with news agencies, we provide a platform for bi+ people to help shape the political and cultural conversations of our time.



Public Education

We produce reports, best practice guides, and workshops to spark industry dialogue on how to create better bi+ characters and portray nontraditional families with openness, compassion, and accuracy.




Policy Change



LGBTQ-inclusive movies earn a staggering 29% more revenue at the box office than movies with no LGBTQ+ content (Monash University)



Over <u>60 percent</u> of LGBTQ+ adults identify as bisexual, or bi.



The future is bi. More than 1 in 10 Gen-Z identify as bisexual.



We researched and published the **first-ever report** exploring the visibility of bi+people and bi+ issues over the **last three decades** in print news, the way bi+people have been depicted, and to what extent bi+ people have been given a platform to tell their own stories.

We are piloting a column with Los Angeles Progressive & Hollywood Progressive to publish emerging and established bi+ writers. We are generating immediate impact:

• 16 articles, reaching over 100K readers!
Given that there were only 654 articles over the last decade in print news where bisexuality was the main subject, this is a significant contribution to advancing the voices of bi+ leaders.

Media Campaign Spotlight

Rewrite the BiLine launched a campaign calling on the most widely syndicated columnist in the world, Dear Abby, to retract her biphobic advice to a mother of a bi woman. And we succeeded!



A mother wrote into Dear Abby after her daughter's fiancé broke off their wedding because she is bi. Dear Abby wrote, "Has it occurred to you that your daughter may be a lesbian who tried to appease you and her father by claiming to be bisexual?" We told @dearabby that she must #dobetter and many of our followers wrote letters to her.

Well, she heard us! **Dear Abby** <u>apologized</u>, "I heard from members of the LGBTQ+ community — in particular, bisexual people — saying I 'could have done better' with my response." She issued a correction, explaining, "I regret that I didn't point out to the parents that their unsupportive response may be a reason their daughter had not come out to them as bisexual earlier."



We published <u>a report</u> that provides the **first qualitative assessment** of top narrative featurelength films and TV shows with bi+ characters.

Aaron Hammersley, a producer & filmmaker
currently at Walt Disney Studios.


We released an **industry guide** for creating authentic and accurate bi+ characters, showcased on Sundance Collab.

We conducted a **training for 60 writers** and creators in the industry, including a writer currently developing an animated comedy series for Mattel, a post production manager with Walt Disney Studios, and an award-winning writer with Warner Bros. Studio.

"As a Black man, I am acutely aware of how media portrayals impact real-life treatment. When Black men are depicted as thugs or dangerous for entertainment value, people (police) treat them as such in real life. Similarly, when bi+ people are depicted as oversexed or conniving, those stereotypes spill over into real-life perceptions and treatment. Representation has material outcomes.

The "Bi+ Narrative Guide" advocates for nuanced portrayals that transcend stereotypes, offering steps and tools for writers to achieve this. At its core, this guide serves as a call to action and a professional demand for filmmakers, studios, and writers to not only do better but to craft narratives that reflect the diverse and complex nature of bisexuality—because real people are affected. We will **scale our pilot project** to elevate the ideas and knowledge of underrepresented bi+voices in more news outlets, while tracking in real time news articles featuring bi+ issues.

We will **improve on-ramps for bi+ creatives** in the entertainment field by launching a **Bi+ Fellowship for TV Writing** to help emerging bi+ screenwriters transform their brilliant premises into page-turning scripts with authentic, nuanced bi+ storylines.

We will expand opportunities for **corporate employees to engage in the bi+ equity movement** so they can drive impact in their studios, production companies, and communities. Programming will include a learning series on effective strategies for bi-normative cinema.

In all that we do, we will prioritize racial equity and intersectionality. White supremacy works in tandem with biphobia, homophobia, transphobia and fear of polyamorous families; perhaps nowhere is this more apparent than in the media, which remains white-centered and dominated by binary views of gender and sexuality. In order to rewrite the bi+ narrative, bi+ liberation requires an explicit and sustained focus on addressing racial disparities and other identity-based marginalization in film, television, and the media.



Meet Our Founder

Christina Fialho (she/her), Founder & President



"I came out later in life. I am not an outlier. According to Pew Research, lesbian and gay people are more likely than bi+ people to be out to most of the people important to them. I did not know I was bi growing up because I did not have a word for my feelings. Society and my Catholic upbringing had built a culture that erased that word from vocabulary within my reach as a teenager. Had there been positive bi+ role models on screen, I might have come out earlier to myself. Had there been cultural acceptance of bi+ people, I might have embraced myself completely at a younger age. I do not want any child to grow up without seeing themselves represented in the films they watch and the stories they read."

Christina Fialho is an award-winning social entrepreneur, attorney, and activist. Her writing and work have appeared in a Grammy-winning artist's music video, an Emmy-winning television series, and many news outlets such as the *New York Times*, *Los Angeles Times*, *Rolling Stone*, *InStyle*, NPR, and MSNBC.


